Process

To amend FMC 22.58.024 Outdoor Storage of Vehicles

Inoperable Vehicles- FMC 22.58.024(a)

Simplify and clarify the code to aid in enforcement

- Prohibits outdoor storage of inoperable vehicles with some provisions
- Expands regulations to include unlicensed vehicles
- Reduces the allowed outdoor storage of screened inoperable vehicles from three to one
- Continues to allow unscreened storage for 14 days for a vehicle awaiting repair



Commercial Vehicles- FMC 22.58.024(b)

Expand and clarify the code to aid in enforcement

- Retains prohibition of commercial vehicles over 10,000 GVW
- Aligns language with home occupation standards on commercial vehicles
- Clarifies the restriction is on both private property and ROW in residential zones
- Exempts delivery and equipment related to an active construction project



Passenger Vehicles- FMC 22.58.024(d)

Address concern with vehicles parking on lawns

 Prohibits parking of vehicles on locations other than designated driveways and parking surfaces





Address concerns raised by the City Council and improve ability to enforce provisions



- Expand recreational vehicle regulations to include motorized and nonmotorized
- Maintain the limit of two for the outdoor storage of recreational vehicles
- Eliminate the provision of additional vehicles with screening

- Limits the storage of RVs and boats to one in the front yard and/or side yard and up to two in a side street side yard and/or in the rear yard
 - (c)(2) One such vehicle may be stored in the side yard, provided it does not extend beyond the front of the house and is screened from the closest abutting property by a solid fence or approved landscaping as defined in subsection (a)(4) of this section.
 - (c)(3) Vehicles shall be may be stored in the side street side yard or rear yard, provided it is screened from neighboring properties and the public right-of-way by a solid fence or approved landscaping as defined in subsection (a)(4) of this section.
 - (c)(4) One vehicle may be located in the front yard if parked perpendicular to the right-of-way, provided the vehicle does not extend beyond the property line and is screened from the closest abutting property by approved landscaping at least six feet in height.

Expanded screening requirements for RVs

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(c)(3) Vehicles shall be may be stored in the side street side yard or rear yard, provided it is screened from neighboring properties and the public right-of-way by a solid fence or approved landscaping as defined in subsection (a)(4) of this section.

(c)(4) One vehicle may be located in the front yard if parked perpendicular to the right-of-way, provided the vehicle does not extend beyond the property line and is screened from the closest abutting property by approved landscaping at least six feet in height.

Created parking surface requirements for RVs

(c)(5) Vehicles shall be parked on an approved driveway, an existing impermeable pad established prior to the effective date of this ordinance, or a permeable, porous, or pervious surfaces that meet or exceed the standards outlined in the latest edition of the Department of Ecology Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington for Low Impact Development.

Created language related to licensing and upkeep of RVs

(c)(6) Vehicles shall be operable and maintained in a clean, well-kept state that does not detract from the appearance of the surrounding area. Inoperable, extensively damaged and/or unlicensed vehicles shall be treated as "junk vehicles" per Chapter 9.64 FMC.

Created language for temporary occupancy of RVs

(c)(7) Subject to the above restrictions, recreational vehicles may be occupied on a temporary basis not to exceed 30 days within one calendar year. Exceptions may be approved by the Director for a period not to exceed 6 months when temporary shelter is required to support an individual experiencing serious illness and needing assistance from the property owner on which the recreational vehicle is located.
