Mayor Hunter T. George called the special meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. and led the pledge of allegiance. Councilmembers David M. Viafore, Shannon Reynolds, Denny Waltier, Blake Surina, and Jamie Nixon. Councilmember Brett Wittner was absent and excused.

#### AGENDA MODIFICATIONS

There were none.

#### **COMMERCIAL MIXED-USE ZONE**

Planning and Building Administrator Stahlnecker briefed the Council on the 19th and Mildred commercial mixed-use area, and requested feedback from Council regarding height restrictions and municipal code zoning. Stahlnecker recommended increasing the current height restrictions from 55-feet to 75-feet and transitioning the commercial mixed-use zone from the traditional hybrid model to a form-based code model.

After a brief discussion on a building moratorium and the benefits and drawbacks of increasing the height, there were no objections for staff to move forward with increasing the height restrictions in that commercial mixed-use zone area to 75-feet.

After a brief discussion on traditional and form-based zoning, design guidelines, encouraging development, affordable housing incentives, and maintaining the City's character, there were no objections for staff to move forward with researching a hybrid zoning style for the 19th and Mildred commercial mixed-use area and strengthen the City's current zoning with code that would model developments such as Proctor Station or Bridgeport town center.

Waltier departed at 6:44 P.M. and returned at 6:46 P.M.

#### WHITTIER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL REDEVELOPMENT

Stahlnecker briefed the Council on the Tacoma School District proposed bond that would include the replacement of Whittier Elementary, stating the school is in a R-4 zone with a conditional use permit and that design guidelines and standards were established for residential construction, not for a new school. Stahlnecker briefed the Council on current parking standards, creating a maximum height for public buildings, and design guidelines, and requested feedback from Council. After a brief discussion on frontage, impact to the immediate neighborhood, building location, height, materials, style, character, lighting, storm retention, parking standards, safety, and bus drop-off, there was a general consensus for staff to develop guidelines for quasi/public buildings in a residential neighborhood within the next 12 months. George indicated that the District's Director of Planning and Construction and their consultant have been invited to brief the Council on this project.

#### ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS: ATTACHED VS. DETACHED APPROVALS

Stahlnecker briefed the Council on the accessory dwelling unit attached versus detached approval review process, stating the Planning Commission was in favor of Council input on this topic. Stahlnecker stated the attached units were reviewed at the staff level with no public notice and detached units required a public hearing before the Planning Commission. Stahlnecker indicated the staff recommendation was to lower the review level for detached accessory dwelling units from a conditional use permit to an administrative use permit as

the approval criteria would not change, notification and a public comment period would still be required, and the applicant would save time and money. After a brief discussion on decreasing costs, increasing the public notice area due to the impacts to the neighborhood, maintaining a public hearing for transparency and public involvement, and hybrid options, there was a general consensus to postpone taking action on this item by one year and for staff to report back to Council.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment Insurance Contract

ITEM 10A.

FROM: Scott Pingel, City Manager

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to approve Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_ to authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with Principal Life Insurance Company for Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment insurance.

**PROPOSAL:** The Council is being asked to authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with Principal Life Insurance Company for Life and AD&D Insurance. This would replace our current life insurance policy with Sun Life Financial, which is a maximum benefit of \$100,000. Principal Life Insurance Company provides a quote for a maximum benefit of \$150,000.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The new policy with Principal Life Insurance Company will reduce the City's life insurance costs by about 40%, and will reduce the City's unfunded life insurance liability by about \$250,000.

**ADVANTAGE:** This change increases the maximum life insurance coverage from \$100,000 to \$150,000 while reducing the overall cost of life insurance to the City.

**DISADVANTAGES:** The quote from Principal Life Insurance Company includes a benefit reduction of 35% at age 65 and an additional 15% reduction at age 70.

ALTERNATIVES: Stay with our current life insurance plan.

**HISTORY:** In the City's Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual under Life Insurance Benefit it reads in part, "... Said policy amount shall be at the sum of one (1) times the annual salary, rounded to the next one thousand (1,000) dollars plus the dollar value of the accrued sick leave as of January 1 each year, rounded to the nearest one thousand (1,000) dollars (to the maximum available through the City's insurance)."

It was with the April 2019 update to the personnel manual that "to the maximum available through the City's insurance" was added to the language. Prior to adding this language, the City essentially had an unfunded liability of \$432,000 due to the pay level and amount of accrued sick leave of some employees. Staff added the language to the personnel manual to overcome this unfunded liability, but we also did so with the intent that we would be looking for life insurance options that provided a benefit above \$100,000. In going after quotes, Principal Life Insurance Company was the only one that provided a maximum benefit of up to \$150,000.

A major caveat for going with Principal Life is that their policy includes a 35% reduction in benefits at age 65, and another 15% reduction at age 70. The staff recommendation is to make the change to Principal Life but to grandfather in those that are currently over the \$150,000 benefit maximum or that fall into the age reduction category. We currently have 2 staff above the \$150,000 maximum benefit between their pay level and the value of accrued sick leave. We also have 2 staff that fall into the age reduction schedule. These 4 staff would be grandfathered in according to the categories where they currently fall outside of the Principal Life categories (Maximum Benefit or Reduction Schedule). By contracting with Principal Life and grandfathering these 4 employees, this would change the City's previous \$432,000 unfunded liability under the current Sun Life policy to \$181,600.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIRCREST, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH PRINCIPAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY FOR LIFE AND ACCIDENTAL DEATH AND DISMEMBERMENT INSURANCE.

WHEREAS, as prescribed in the April 1, 2019 City of Fircrest Personnel Policies and Procedures manual (Resolution No. 1581), the City's policy for Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment insurance amount shall be at the sum of one (1) times the annual salary, rounded to the next one thousand (1,000) dollars plus the dollar value of the accrued sick leave as of January 1 each year, rounded to the nearest one thousand (1,000) dollars (to the maximum available through the City's insurance); and

WHEREAS, the City of Firerest currently has an insurance policy with Sun Life Financial to provide the City's Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment insurance (AD&D) as a benefit for regular, full-time employees, which has a limited guaranteed benefit of up \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a proposal from Principal Life Insurance Company to provide Life and AD&D benefits to the regular, full-time employees of the City of an increased guaranteed benefit up to \$150,000 (a reduction in coverage by 35% at age 65 and an additional reduction of 15% at age 70); and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to accept the proposal of Principal Life Insurance Company, to provide the City's Life and AD&D employee benefits beginning November 1, 2019, and to have the City Manager or his/her designee as the acting group representative. Now, Therefore

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FIRCREST:

**Section 1.** The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract with Principal Life Insurance Company for Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment insurance.

**Section 2.** Any existing current regular, full-time employee of the City of Firerest who exceeds the \$150,000 maximum benefit per the policy formula above (one (1) times the annual salary plus the dollar value of accrued sick leave as of January 1 each year) as of November 1, 2019 shall be grandfathered in and be eligible to receive the full current amount per the policy formula. The difference between their current amount above the \$150,000 maximum will be funded by the City of Fircrest.

Section 3. Any existing current regular, full-time employee of the City of Firerest who meets the age limitation reductions as of November 1, 2019 shall be grandfathered in and the City of Fircrest shall fund the reduction difference.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move to adopt Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_, authorizing the City Manager to execute Amendment #8 to the agreement with Leavitt Group NW for insurance broker services.

**PROPOSAL:** The Council is being asked to authorize the City Manager to execute Amendment #8 to the agreement with Leavitt Group NW for insurance broker services. The City of Fircrest is a member of the Cities Insurance Association of Washington (CIAW) pool. The Interlocal Agreement with the CIAW requires the City to designate a servicing representative to act as liaison for the needs of Fircrest. The duties of the service representative, include but are not limited to, providing local claims assistance, the securing of underwriting information, completion of applications, updating of vehicle lists and information and other such functions as the CIAW Board of Directors may establish. The amendment will be from September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Funds are available for this expenditure in the Insurance Line Item of the Non-Departmental Budget. The cost will be \$7,250 for the term of the agreement, which has not increased since 2014.

**ADVANTAGE:** Continuation of this agreement complies with the requirement to have a serving representative. Leavitt Group NW has provided very valuable assistance in working with CIAW and with claims and preventative measures for the City.

**DISADVANTAGES:** None known.

**ALTERNATIVE:** Not designate a service representative and be billed 10% of the annual cost for insurance by the Cities Insurance Association of Washington in accordance with the Interlocal Agreement.

**HISTORY:** The Interlocal Agreement with CIAW was approved on February 12, 2008, effective March 1, 2008. This resolution will continue the required insurance broker services, which were initiated in March 2008. Leavitt Group NW, formerly known as Bannon, Carlson & Kessel, has provided this service to Fircrest since December 2012.
