PUBLIC HEARING

A. Extension of the 6-month Moratorium adopted by Ordinance No. 1644

At 7:20 P.M., George opened the public hearing. Planning and Building Administrator Stahlnecker briefed the Council on the 6-month moratorium extension and work plan George invited Councilmember comment; Viafore asked if we have received any public comments with regard to the moratorium. Stahlnecker stated that she has had conversations with representatives of Sunrise Center however has not received any for or against statements. George invited public testimony; none were provided. At 7:24 P.M., George closed the public hearing.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Ordinance No. 1654: Extension of the six-month moratorium

Nixon MOVED to adopt Ordinance No. 1654, renewing the six-month moratorium adopted on October 8, 2019 for an additional six-months, prohibiting the submission or acceptance of any development applications for new development, additions, and alterations in the property comprised of 44 acres, located at the northwest corner of the city, bounded by 19th Street West and Mildred Street West, zoned Commercial Mixed Use and Residential-30, and proposed to be designated as a countywide center in the countywide planning policies, said moratorium to be in effect while the city performs the activities described in this ordinance; seconded by Wittner. George invited councilmember comment; Viafore commented that he will support the adoption of the ordinance due to the lack of community concern to date; George invited public comment; none were provided. The Motion Carried (7-0).

B. Ordinance No. 1655: PROS Plan Update Approval

Parks & Recreation Director Grover briefed the Council on PROS plan history and gave a brief overview of the updates. Grover also updated Council that there will be a more robust PROS plan evaluations update in two years. Viafore MOVED to adopt Ordinance No. 1655, adopting the 2020 Park Recreation and Open Space Plan and amending FMC 10.02.010 and Section 1 of Ordinance 1066; seconded by Wittner. George invited councilmember comment; George commented that we are committed to revisiting the PROS plan and engaging the community when we update the plan. George invited public comment; none were provided. The Motion Carried (7-0).

C. Resolution No. 1650: Project Inspection and Reporting Services Contract

City Manager Pingel briefed the Council on the proposed resolution that would allow the City Manager to execute an amendment to the contract that will allow Parametrix to provide services until the end of the Pool and Bathhouse project. Nixon MOVED to adopt Resolution 1650, authorizing the City Manager to execute amendment #1 to the contract for project inspection and reporting services for the Fircrest Pool and Bathhouse project with Parametrix; seconded by Wittner. George invited councilmember comment; none were provided. George invited public comment; none were provided. The Motion Carried (7-0).

CITY MANAGER COMMENTS

City Manager Pingel reported that we still plan to have Mr. Rangwala return for the April study session and the Pierce County Council has suspended all their meetings until May 1st. Pingel also updated Council on the staffing throughout the City over the next few weeks. Viafore asked about overtime pay for utility callouts for the Public Works crew.

Pingel also briefed the Council on the Families First Relief Act and how the city plans to comply with the new Federal regulations. George commented that he will be on a call with Congressman Heck tomorrow and he will be discussing possible public employer reimbursements for the FFCRA mandates that are available to private employers.

Wittner asked about the impacts to the construction of the pool and bathhouse and will construction be able to continue. Pingel informed Council that he has asked for that clarification and will report back once he hears from the State.

Waltier asked about how the Police Department plans to address the potential public gatherings that are in violation of the Stay at Home order. Cheesman responded that he plans to provide education to those who may violate the order and as a last resort could cite an RCW but prefers to educate the public.

Barrentine commented that State has implemented a moratorium on evictions and expressed that if the State does not extend the moratorium, that the City have a plan in place to be ready to act. Brief discussion was held on that the authority might be at the State level and the City may not be able to act, however, may make a proclamation to show support.

DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

 Police Chief Cheesman briefed the Council about the lunch program at Whittier Elementary and that the teachers of Whittier Elementary will be conducting a parade of cars and plan to drive by bus stops and neighborhoods. Our Police Department will be apart of that parade.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

- Viafore asked if staff has heard from ARC with an update on the cost of the gas line to the
 Community Center kitchen and that the Census 2020 has listed Fircrest addresses as Tacoma
 addresses. Viafore commented that he appreciates the intent of the working with our utility
 customers and not perform utility shut offs but does not believe that staff has the authority to
 waive that fee in the Fircrest Municipal Code. Viafore also commented that our revenues may
 be down this year and the City needs to be prepared.
- Reynolds: none at this time.
- Wittner; none at this time.
- Barrentine commented that he would like to thank staff with the Census 2020 outreach and also wanted to thank Viafore for making the motion to allow remote attendance for the next forty (40) days.
- Waltier commented that he is concerned that the Census lists our addresses as Tacoma and the effects that may have.
- Nixon commented that he would like to thank staff for the meeting setup, and he is pleased that staff is relaying accurate information. He would like to express his concern that COVID-19 will not be ending soon and we need to take this seriously to keep people safe.

FISCAL IMPACT: The fiscal impact at this point of the Emergency Declaration comes down to the cost of the March door tag fees, which is \$9.00 per tag. We delivered about 100 door tags in March notifying utility customers that their bills were overdue, which equates to about \$900.00. It is anticipated that this number could grow in May when new door tags are delivered.

ADVANTAGE:

The emergency declaration provides the City broad authority to act within its limits all such local police, sanitation and other regulations as are not in conflict with general laws. More specifically, RCW 38.52.070 provides cities and towns with power, in the event of an emergency such as COVID-19, to enter into contracts and incur obligations to combat the emergency, protect health and safety of persons and property, and provide emergency assistance to victims. This RCW specifically authorizes cities to bypass certain statutory requirements to exercise powers without regard to time-consuming procedures and formalities prescribed by law.

At this point, we do not plan on using the declaration to bypass the City Council or make decisions without your input. Currently, we have closed City buildings to the public and closed our playgrounds and gated sport courts. As pointed out above, we would like to waive the door tag fee for the March door tags, and we anticipate doing the same for the May door tags. Except for when it is not possible to do so during the emergency, the City will still adhere to public notice and public records requirements.

DISADVANTAGES: Lost revenue due to waived fees during the current emergency.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not declare an emergency.

HISTORY: On February 29, 2020, Governor Inslee proclaimed that a State of Emergency exists in all counties in Washington State. On March 23, 2020, Governor Inslee issued a Stay Home – Stay Healthy Order requiring everyone in the State to stay home for 2 weeks unless they are pursuing an essential activity. On March 24, 2020, Governor Inslee issued a proclamation temporarily suspending several provisions in the Open Public Meetings Act and the Public Records Act. This proclamation requires governing bodies to provide remote options for attending public meetings and that the only actions to be taken should be necessary or routine. On April 2, 2020, the Stay Home – Stay Healthy order was extended through May 4, 2020. All new business that is not necessary or routine has been pushed back to at least the May 12, 2020 City Council meeting.

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

1. I move to adopt Resolution No. _______, authorizing the placement of an Emergency Medical Care and Services levy for the years 2021 through 2027 on the primary election to be held August 4, 2020.

2. I move to adopt Resolution No. _______, authorizing the placement of an Emergency Medical Care and Services levy for the years 2021 through 2027 on the general election to be held November 3, 2020.

PROPOSAL: Council is being asked to adopt the attached resolutions which would place the renewal of the Emergency Medical Care and Services (EMS) levy at \$.50/\$1,000 of assessed valuation on both the August 4, 2020 primary election and the November 3, 2020 general election ballots to enable the citizens to vote for or against the tax levy. The uninterrupted continuation of a six-year levy under RCW 84.52.069 must be specifically authorized by a majority of the registered voters thereof approving a proposition authorizing the levies submitted at a general or special election.

The resolution to place the issue on the general election to be held on November 3, 2020 is needed because the deadline for submitting resolutions to place the issue on the November 3rd ballot is August 4, 2020, which is the date of the primary election. In order to meet this deadline, Council is being asked to adopt the resolution now so that it is ready should the levy fail in the primary election. Should the levy fail on August 4th, the issue would then be placed automatically on the November 3rd ballot. If the levy passes on August 4th, the resolution could be rescinded.

FISCAL IMPACT: The fiscal impact would be the cost of the election(s). The cost of the elections is budgeted for in the 2020 budget. The 2020 budget anticipates EMS tax revenue to be \$335,204. The EMS levy provides for \$.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. A new EMS levy would remain the same at \$.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation (the tax rate can be as high as 50 cents per thousand dollars assessed, the maximum allowed under RCW 84.52.069).

ADVANTAGE:

The uninterrupted continuation levy would continue to provide funds for EMS services from the Tacoma Fire Department.

DISADVANTAGES: Cost of the election.

ALTERNATIVES: None that is feasible.

HISTORY: Fircrest voters approved EMS levies in 1991, 1996, 2002, 2008 and 2014. At the August 05, 2014 Primary Election, the Fircrest voters approved the EMS levy for the years 2015 through 2020. The levy was for \$0.50 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. The vote was 83.87% in favor of the measure. That levy expires on December 31, 2020.

Emergency medical care and service levies.

- (1) As used in this section, "taxing district" means a county, emergency medical service district, city or town, public hospital district, urban emergency medical service district, regional fire protection service authority, or fire protection district.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection (10) of this section, a taxing district may impose additional regular property tax levies in an amount equal to fifty cents or less per thousand dollars of the assessed value of property in the taxing district. The tax is imposed (a) each year for six consecutive years, (b) each year for ten consecutive years, or (c) permanently. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a permanent tax levy under this section, or the initial imposition of a six-year or ten-year levy under this section, must be specifically authorized by a majority of at least three-fifths of the registered voters thereof approving a proposition authorizing the levies submitted at a general or special election, at which election the number of persons voting "yes" on the proposition must constitute three-fifths of a number equal to forty percent of the total number of voters voting in such taxing district at the last preceding general election when the number of registered voters voting on the proposition does not exceed forty percent of the total number of voters voting in such taxing district in the last preceding general election; or by a majority of at least three-fifths of the registered voters thereof voting on the proposition when the number of registered voters voting on the proposition exceeds forty percent of the total number of voters voting in such taxing district in the last preceding general election. The subsequent approval of a six-year or ten-year tax levy under this section must be specifically authorized by a majority of the registered voters thereof approving a proposition authorizing the levies submitted at a general or special election. If the entire region comprising a newly formed regional fire protection service authority was subject to the levy authorized under this section immediately prior to the creation of the authority under chapter 52.26 RCW, the initial imposition of a six-year or ten-year tax levy under this section may be approved by a majority of the registered voters thereof approving the creation of the authority and the related service plan. Ballot propositions must conform with RCW 29A.36.210. A taxing district may not submit to the voters at the same election multiple propositions to impose a levy under this section.
- (3) A taxing district imposing a permanent levy under this section must provide for separate accounting of expenditures of the revenues generated by the levy. The taxing district must maintain a statement of the accounting which must be updated at least every two years and must be available to the public upon request at no charge.
- (4)(a) A taxing district imposing a permanent levy under this section must provide for a referendum procedure to apply to the ordinance or resolution imposing the tax. This referendum procedure must specify that a referendum petition may be filed at any time with a filing officer, as identified in the ordinance or resolution. Within ten days, the filing officer must confer with the petitioner concerning form and style of the petition, issue the petition an identification number, and secure an accurate, concise, and positive ballot title from the designated local official. The petitioner has thirty days in which to secure the signatures of not less than fifteen percent of the registered voters of the taxing district, as of the last general election, upon petition forms which contain the ballot title and the full text of the measure to be referred. The filing officer must verify the sufficiency of the signatures on the petition and, if sufficient valid signatures are properly submitted, must certify the referendum measure to the next election within the taxing district if one is to be held within one hundred eighty days from the date of filing of the referendum petition, or at a special election to be called for that purpose in accordance with RCW 29A.04.330.
- (b) The referendum procedure provided in this subsection (4) is exclusive in all instances for any taxing district imposing the tax under this section and supersedes the procedures provided under all other statutory or charter provisions for initiative or referendum which might otherwise apply.
- (5) Any tax imposed under this section may be used only for the provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and

related equipment, supplies, vehicles and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical services.

- (6) If a county levies a tax under this section, no taxing district within the county may levy a tax under this section. If a regional fire protection service authority imposes a tax under this section, no other taxing district that is a participating fire protection jurisdiction in the regional fire protection service authority may levy a tax under this section. No other taxing district may levy a tax under this section if another taxing district has levied a tax under this section within its boundaries: PROVIDED, That if a county levies less than fifty cents per thousand dollars of the assessed value of property, then any other taxing district may levy a tax under this section equal to the difference between the rate of the levy by the county and fifty cents: PROVIDED FURTHER, That if a taxing district within a county levies this tax, and the voters of the county subsequently approve a levying of this tax, then the amount of the taxing district levy within the county must be reduced, when the combined levies exceed fifty cents. Whenever a tax is levied countywide, the service must, insofar as is feasible, be provided throughout the county: PROVIDED FURTHER. That no countywide levy proposal may be placed on the ballot without the approval of the legislative authority of a majority of at least seventy-five percent of all cities exceeding a population of fifty thousand within the county: AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That this section and RCW 36.32.480 may not prohibit any city or town from levying an annual excess levy to fund emergency medical services: AND PROVIDED, FURTHER, That if a county proposes to impose tax levies under this section, no other ballot proposition authorizing tax levies under this section by another taxing district in the county may be placed before the voters at the same election at which the county ballot proposition is placed: AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That any taxing district emergency medical service levy that is limited in duration and that is authorized subsequent to a county emergency medical service levy that is limited in duration, expires concurrently with the county emergency medical service levy. A fire protection district that has annexed an area described in subsection (10) of this section may levy the maximum amount of tax that would otherwise be allowed, notwithstanding any limitations in this subsection (6).
 - (7) The limitations in RCW 84.52.043 do not apply to the tax levy authorized in this section.
- (8) If a ballot proposition approved under subsection (2) of this section did not impose the maximum allowable levy amount authorized for the taxing district under this section, any future increase up to the maximum allowable levy amount must be specifically authorized by the voters in accordance with subsection (2) of this section at a general or special election.
- (9) The limitation in RCW **84.55.010** does not apply to the first levy imposed pursuant to this section following the approval of such levy by the voters pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.
- (10) For purposes of imposing the tax authorized under this section, the boundary of a county with a population greater than one million five hundred thousand does not include all of the area of the county that is located within a city that has a boundary in two counties, if the locally assessed value of all the property in the area of the city within the county having a population greater than one million five hundred thousand is less than two hundred fifty million dollars.
 - (11) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
- (a) "Fire protection jurisdiction" means a fire protection district, city, town, Indian tribe, or port district; and
- (b) "Participating fire protection jurisdiction" means a fire protection district, city, town, Indian tribe, or port district that is represented on the governing board of a regional fire protection service authority.

Findings—Intent—2011 c 365: "(1) The legislature finds that King county currently imposes an emergency medical services levy throughout the entire county. The legislature further finds that the

city of Milton is located partially within King and Pierce counties and the residents of Milton within King county pay the county emergency medical services levy. The legislature further finds that King county, through an interlocal agreement with the city of Milton, has not provided emergency medical services to the city for many years and instead has remitted the county emergency medical services levy collected within the city back to the city. The legislature further finds that the city of Milton has collected only twenty cents per thousand dollars of assessed valuation under its city emergency medical services levy, and not the full fifty cents authorized by the city's voters, because state law limits the city's levy, as well as any other taxing district's emergency medical services levy, if the county also imposes the tax. The legislature further finds that the city of Milton is exploring the possibility of being annexed by a fire protection district located in Pierce county; however, if the district annexes the entire city, including the portion in King county, the district would have to lower its emergency medical services levy as required under state law.

(2) It is the intent of the legislature to address this unusual situation by excluding the portion of the city of Milton within King county from the county emergency medical services levy. It is the further intent of the legislature to clarify that a fire protection district is able to levy the full amount of emergency medical services levy otherwise allowed by law throughout the entire city."
