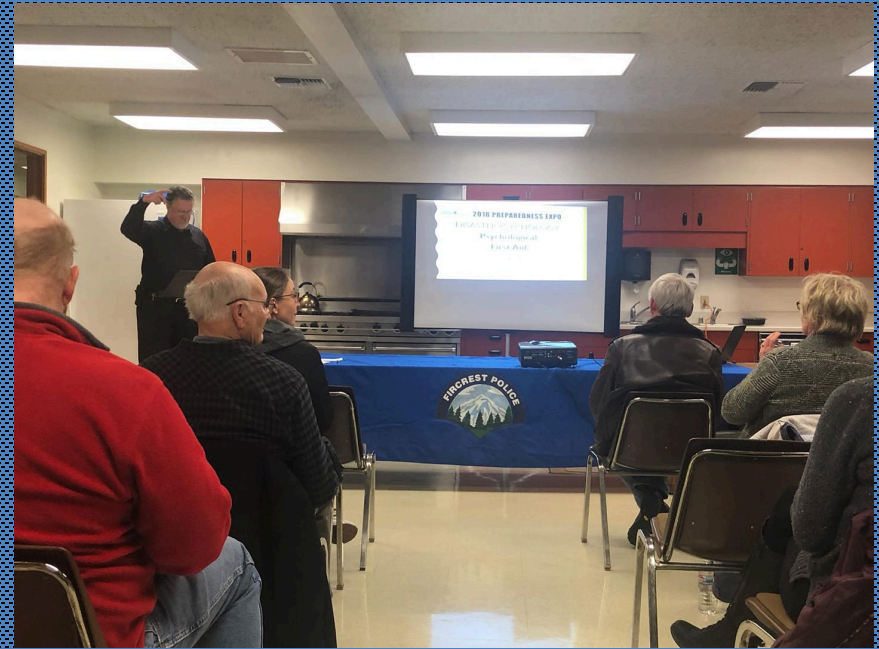

National Night Out

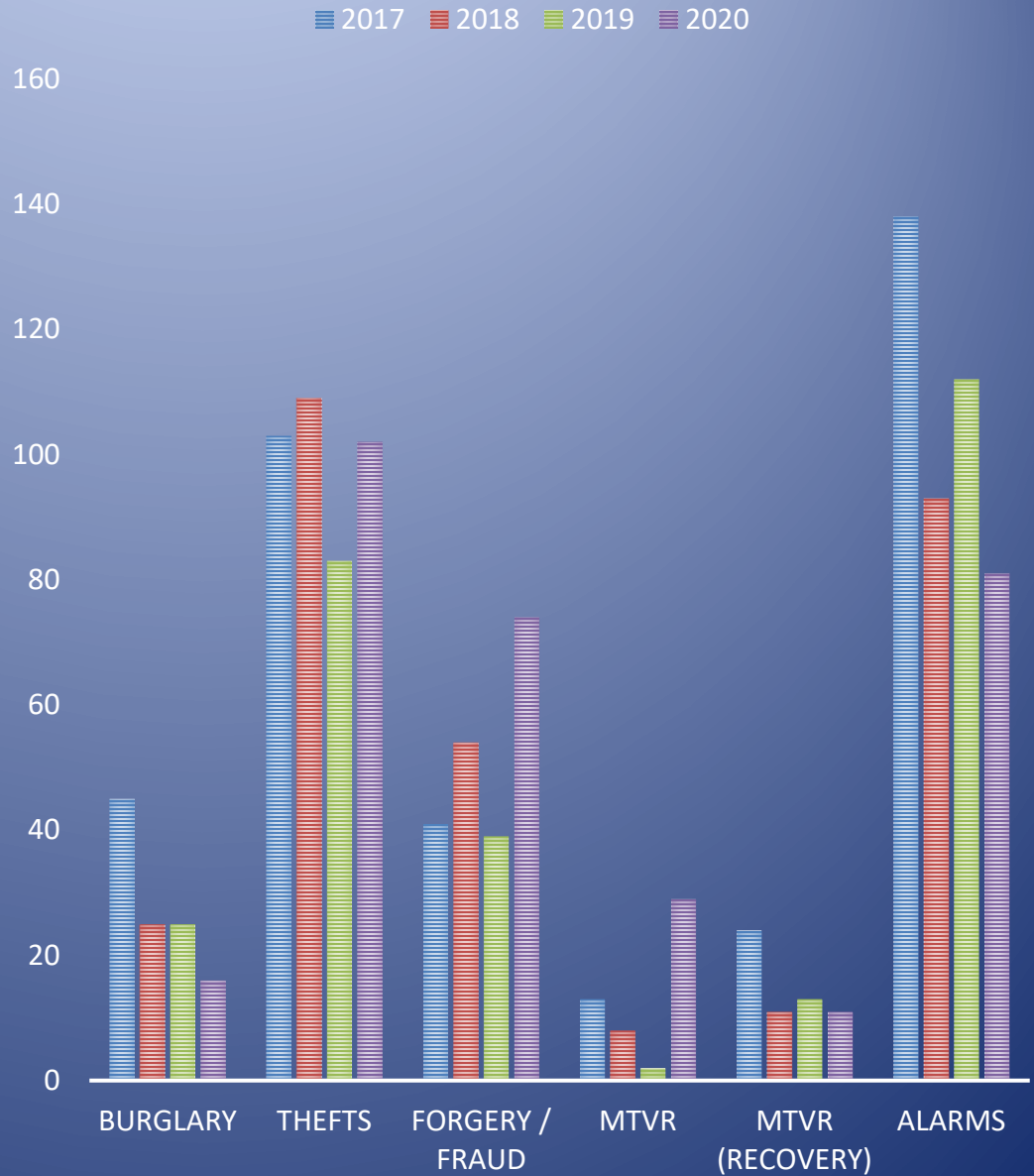
