FIRCREST CITY COUNCIL STUDY SESSION

BACKGROUND: The last City Council Workshop was held on June 18, 2018. The primary goal/project that came out of that workshop was completing the new pool and community center project. Other goals/projects came out of that session that the City has since completed also, but the pool and community center have been the major focus for the better part of the last 4 years.

Based on the very brief feedback from the April 18th Study Session, each City Councilmember has a little different idea about a format and the extent of doing another workshop. My recommendation, then, is that we at least do an extended Study Session in June or July to come up with goals/projects for next year, for the next 2-3 year period, and any longer term goals/projects that we want to keep on our radar (3-5 year period). I would be able to guide such a session.

It would be great to establish overarching or strategic goals that projects/objectives might fall under that capture what we want Fircrest to be, but I am not sure how possible that is in one session. These would be bigger more constant strategic goal statements that do not change from year to year, but each of our objectives/projects would fall under these strategic goals. For example, we might identify developing sidewalks on 44th Street as a project for 2024. The strategic goal that might fall under could be something like "Develop and maintain infrastructure to improve livability." The pool and community center project might have fallen under a strategic goal such as "Maintain and improve Fircrest facilities to provide recreational/cultural opportunities."

Other topics from which to develop strategic goals might include the following:

- Fiscal Responsibility
- Communications and engaging the community
- Promoting community wellness and safety
- Protecting and Enhancing the "feel" of Fircrest
- Creating a vibrant economic environment
- Promoting honest, open and transparent government

It may be worth starting with establishing the strategic goals and then moving to the projects and objectives. Attached is a sample of what this may have looked like if we had used this format in 2018 moving into 2019. The main difference with how I would approach it is that I believe it would be more beneficial to determine strategic goals first and then establish projects and objectives. What happened with our consultant in 2018 was that he simply categorized the goals and projects after we came up with them rather than starting with the strategic goals.

Questions for the Council to consider:

- Can we plan on a longer July Study Session to tackle strategic goals and multi-year projects/objectives?
- Is the proposed format, or something similar, acceptable?
- What else would you like to accomplish in an abbreviated Workshop/Extended Study Session?
