CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, AND ROLL CALL

A. Staff Introductions

B. Pierce Transit Update - University Place Councilmember Keel

University Place Councilmember Keel briefed the Council on recent Pierce Transit updates. Councilmember Keel reported on a potential sale tax increase, BRT Route 1, BRT Route 2, and reduced Pierce Transit bus route stops and renovations. BRT Route 2 will be partially running through 19th Street in Fircrest and through Bridgeport Way in University Place. Viafore commented on his support to continue partnerships with University Place.

C. Proclamation: LGBTQ+ Pride Month

Wittner introduced the LGBTQ+ Pride Month proclamation, where the pride flag is to be flown at the Community Center. There was a general discussion including the logistics, implementing a flag policy, addressing community needs, and demonstrating City support of Pride Month. Bufford read the proclamation into the record. George MOVED to authorize the Mayor's signature on a proclamation proclaiming the month of June as LGBTQ+ Pride Month in the City of Fircrest; seconded by Bufford. Wittner invited councilmember comment. Reynolds requested to have a flag policy drafted. Wittner invited public comment;

Wittner stated that he works for Morton McGoldrick law firm, which had represented the Bourgaize family, and represents the legal entity of the owner of the property. Wittner stated that he does not have contact with the legal entity and his law firm may refer the legal entity to a different law firm to avoid conflict of interest.

Pingel requested to include Police Guild labor negotiations in the Executive Session. Pingel also reported that the City is applying for the COPS grant and would like to have a letter of support from the Council. There was a consensus to bring a resolution of support at the next regular council meeting. Lastly, the NewCold Storage land use designation letter will need to be revised to address the Tacoma City Council.
