BACKGROUND:


Staff has had a couple of preliminary meetings with the potential developer for the Mildred Property.

We do not want to speak to text amendments or specific code requirements. This is for informational purposes only and to provide you with a little insight on a potential project.




A Mixed Use Project February 17, 2022 Fircrest, WA









South West Corner View
