The Department

The Fircrest Police Department operates on a 2023 budget of \$2.2 million and employs approximately 12 FTEs. The mission of the Fircrest Police Department is to work in partnership with the community to protect life and property and to enhance the quality of life in the City through proactive problem solving, fair and equitable law enforcement, and effective use of resources. Functions and programs include patrol, traffic enforcement, investigations, crime prevention, emergency response, narcotics, vice related activities, school lunch buddies' program, school safety programs and special services. The Department is committed to building relationships with community members while providing the highest level of service to keep the City's citizens safe.



Law Enforcement Youth Camp

Law Enforcement Youth Camp (LEYC) purpose is to provide a privilege for good kids who may be in disadvantaged situation, in need of positive interaction with law enforcement, and/or whose family situations might limit them from experiencing the fun and leadership skills that camp provides.

The program also includes activities in the Spring, Fall, and winter. Campers are boys and girls ages 9 to 11. Many of our campers are kids we encounter, and get to know through our jobs.

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Public Works

Capital Projects 2023-24:



Over the next couple of years, the City will see a multitude of Capital Projects. These projects will range from the design and construction phases across all Utilities. Public Works is nearing the final design approval for the Lift Station upgrade project at 44th St W and 67th Ave W. The construction for this project may start in Fall of 2023 but will likely carry over into 2024 due to manufacturing constraints. Another Sewer Utility project scheduled for construction is replacing the backyard sewer main of the 100 block of Farallone Ave and El Dorado Ave via pipe bursting. There are

also three Streets/Sidewalk projects in the preliminary design phase. The two street projects are asphalt grind and overlays for Regents Blvd from Alameda Ave to 67th St W and South Orchard St from Regents Blvd to Holly Dr. The South Orchard St project includes the intersection abutting the City of Tacoma and may go out construction bids in the Fall of 2023. Public Works staff are working diligently to join efforts with Tacoma to pave this entire intersection. The Emerson St sidewalk extension project from Woodside Dr to 67th St W is funded for design in 2023 and construction in 2024. Replacement of old undersized water mains will take place on both Rose St and Yale St from Contra Costa Ave to Del Monte Ave. The City has one current Stormwater project which may be completed by the time this article is published. This is a stormwater pretreatment project that will replace five separate catch basin structures to protect the headwaters of Leach Creek.
