

2018 - 2019

The input from the citizens stressed that the <u>most</u> important consideration was meeting the continued need for youth and family activities through programs or facilities at the existing parks. Of primary focus, with overall support from citizens and Committee members, were improvements to the City's critically important recreation facility — the Roy H. Murphy Community Center and adjacent seasonal swimming pool. Many were observant to point out that limited funding and a changing economy will play a role in the next steps to planning the future of the Community Center, but also noted the continual demand for positive opportunities that are vital from the perspective of most residents.




Concept 1: Leach Creek Runs Through it






Concept 2: Community Anchor








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Community Survey Summary


