Below is the weekly overview of upcoming events, meetings, and other items of interest for the City. The update includes reports from City departments on various programs, projects, and achievements.

1. July 23rd, 2024 – Council Meeting Recap

Action items at the Tuesday, July 23rd regular City Council meeting included:

- Appointed Andreas Schonger to the Planning Commission
- Issued a National Night Out Proclamation.
- Approved an Applicant Resolution/Authorization for the Fircrest Park Backstop Restoration Project RCO Grant Application.
- Approved Change Order #1 to the South Orchard Grind & Overlay Construction Contract.
- Approved an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Tacoma for the South Orchard Grind & Overlay Project.

2. Election Reminder

Ballots for the August 6, 2024, Primary Election have been sent to registered voters. To be counted, ballots must be mailed or dropped off in postage-free drop boxes by Election Day. Ballot drop boxes are open 24 hours a day during elections and will continue to accept ballots until 8:00 PM on Election Day. For your convenience, there is a ballot drop box in front of Fircrest City Hall.

3. Voter Registration

There is still time to register to vote in the Primary Election on August 6th. There are three ways to register to vote: online, by mail, and in person. The deadline to register online and by mail is July 29, 2024. The deadline to register in person is August 6th. 4. Administration Update

Administration highlights include:

• The Employee Safety Committee met on Monday, July 22nd, to discuss lockdown and active shooter training and review quarterly department inspection reports.

- City Clerk Arlette Burkhart received her Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC) certificate. The CMC
 designation requires completing extensive educational programs and having pertinent
 government experience. Clerk Burkhart plans to continue her professional development by
 pursuing her Master Municipal Clerk (MMC) designation in the coming years.
- City Manager Dawn Masko is reviewing the proposed amendments to the Fircrest Civil Service Rules. Following her review, the amendments will be sent to legal counsel for further review.
- City Council photographs have now been updated in the City Hall lobby.
- Clerk Burkhart submitted invoices for the Wellhouse #6/7 repairs to the City's insurance carrier, CIAW, for reimbursement. The total repair and restoration costs amounted to \$115,580.33.
- The Civil Service Lateral Police Officer Eligibility List has been updated and is available on the City's website and is posted on the City Hall bulletin board. To view the current eligibility list, please visit the Civil Service Commission page on the City website at Civil Service Commission.
- City Manager Masko continued evaluating year-to-date and historical revenues and expenditures, met with attorneys on various issues, and continued reviewing the Teamsters Collective Bargaining Agreement in advance of negotiations.
- Clerk Burkhart is working with Parks & Recreation Director Jeff Grover to establish a formal volunteer program. They have contacted the City's insurer to schedule a training course on "Developing and Managing a Volunteer Program."
- Clerk Burkhart created an internal procedure for processing public records to provide requestors
 with the fullest assistance and the timeliest possible action on requests for information per <u>RCW</u>
 <u>A2.56.100</u>. City Manager Masko is currently reviewing the procedure before it "goes live."
- Clerk Burkhart recently joined the Pierce County Clerk's & Finance Officer's Association. The organization provides resources and networking for clerks in Pierce County.
- The City received six public records requests this week, bringing the 2024 total to 185 requests. At this time last year, the City had received 160 public records requests.
- In the last 30 days, the City's website has had 59,355 page views from 20,444 users. Sessions are up 28%, and users are up 19% from the previous 30 days.

5. Finance Department Update

- Interim Finance Director Julie Dunbar continued working on bank reconciliations and month-end reports and reviewed daily cash, utility billing transactions, accounts payable, and payroll.
- Interim Director Dunbar and IT Systems Coordinator Chris Bunger met with Locke Systems, the City's IT Managed Service Provider (MSP), this week. This quarterly business review (QBR) meeting is required per our contract. Discussion items included developing a network diagram with physical and logical network maps, patch panel cabling, documenting data backups and schedules, and enabling remote device management. Apple Business Manager/Apple Business Essentials, which relates to setting up Apple configuration to facilitate troubleshooting of city-issued cell phones, was also discussed. Suggested future project proposals include SCADA modernization and VM BIOS upgrades (Virtual Machine Basic Input/Output System).
- Accountant II Megan Ryan has done a phenomenal job managing the implementation of the
 electronic timesheet program and continues to be a resource for all staff. The vendor's
 configuration is nearly complete, and we are slated to "Go Live" on August 5th. Over 90% of
 staff are already utilizing the program.

• Interim Director Dunbar and Accountant Wanda Wells are working together to prepare budget worksheets for department directors.

6. Planning & Building Update

The City's middle housing consultant, Kimley-Horn, will host an Open House on Tuesday, July 30th, at the Roy H. Murphy Community Center from 6:00 to 9:00 PM. Kimley-Horn will be available to share middle housing strategies, answer questions, obtain community feedback, and engage in small discussion groups. Can't make it? Presentation materials will be made available on the City's website for review after the event at https://www.cityoffircrest.net/middle-housing, and hard copies will be available at City Hall and the Community Center. Stay tuned to the Middle Housing webpage for more information.

Permitting & Current Planning

- Assistant Planner Natasha Kolostyak attended the South Sound Housing Affordability Partners staff work group meeting this week.
- Community Development Director Mark Newman and Assistant Planner Kolostyak attended MRSC's Summer 2024 Land Use Case Law Update webinar, which reviewed regulatory developments impacting planning and land use. The City obtained a grant from its insurance carrier for Assistant Planner Kolostyak's registration fee.
- CD Director Newman spent time reviewing a Tacoma Public School's request to remove several dead, diseased, and dying trees from Wainwright Elementary School.
- We continue to be busy issuing over-the-counter (OTC) building, mechanical, plumbing, and reroofing permits. Applicants are receiving same-day or one-business-day turnaround time for OTC permits. For larger projects and remodel permits, the City's building reviewer is running 2-3 weeks behind schedule. Please check in with our team so that your project stays on schedule.
- We know that summertime can be busy with vacations, holidays, and also home renovation projects. Just a friendly reminder to check with the Planning & Building Department ahead of time before you start construction on your new deck, covered patio, or accessory structure to first verify whether a permit is required. For new plumbing and mechanical work, a good rule of thumb is that a remodel permit will be required when any drywall is removed. Exposed framing, pipes, and insulation, all indicate that a remodel permit is required, along with floor plans showing where the work is located. Long Range Planning

- Our consultant, Kimley-Horn, braved the heat to meet with the public during Fircrest FUN Days on Saturday, July 20th. They will be compiling comments received, presentation materials, and survey responses, which we will share at a later date.
- CD Director Newman is reviewing pre-application meeting materials for the Hanover Fircrest project (formerly known as the Prose Project), a proposed mixed-use development. The developer will give a high-level overview of their proposal at the August 19th City Council Study Session.
- Share input on the updated draft middle housing model ordinance and user guide here. This update reflects changes based on HB 2321, passed in 2024 to revise HB 1110 (2023), and comments received to date. Commerce requests feedback by August 7th.

Code Enforcement

- The City received five new code enforcement requests this week:
 - Concern regarding discarded items left in the City right-of-way (ROW)/planting strip along the 300 block of Eldorado Avenue. City staff sent a notice of violation letter to the property owner.
 - o Concern regarding a collapsed deck along the 300 block of Eldorado Avenue. City staff sent a notice of violation letter to the property owner.
 - o Concern regarding a food pantry encroaching into the City ROW along the 700 block of Regents Blvd. City staff sent a notice of violation letter to the property owner.
 - Concern regarding accumulated trash and graffiti along the 2100 block of Mildred Street W.
 City staff are reviewing the case.
- The City is also following up on several cases already under review:
 - Concern regarding exposed home wrap and insulation along the 1300 block of Aloha Lane. A building inspector will complete an inspection on the property this week.
 - o Concern regarding an unpermitted accessory structure along the 400 block of Alameda Avenue. A building inspector will complete an inspection on this property this week.
 - o Additionally, the City is aware of transient merchants soliciting residents without a permit and is contacting all known businesses in violation of <u>FMC 5.08</u>.

7. Police Department Update

• Fircrest officers responded to 151 calls for service from 7/14/2024 to 7/21/2024, including 98 traffic stops, which generated 71 notices of infraction. The chart below provides additional information on call activity.

8. Parks & Recreation Update

Administration

- The final submission for the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) grant to replace the backstops at Fircrest Park is due on August 15th. Parks & Recreation Director Jeff Grover is working on refining the grant wording, site plan, potential products, and other final details. Additionally, he is working on a few small components required for the Fircrest Park RCO Youth Athletic Facilities (YAF) Athletic Field Grant.
- As previously mentioned by the City Manager, the City of University Place (UP) has reached out to explore a partnership for the 2024 and 2025 youth sports seasons. Director Grover and Recreation Coordinator Ryan Brown will be meeting with University Place staff next week to tour potential sites for youth basketball and youth baseball. This is in preparation for the possibility of partnering with them and incorporating newly created UP teams into our program.
- Director Grover is comparing pool usage numbers at the halfway point of the season and working on a revenue comparison between 2023 and 2024. This will be included in next week's City Manager Update.
- Director Grover would like to personally welcome Dorothy Cottrill to her new position as Community Center Office Assistant. This is a permanent, part-time role, and Dorothy will be the face of the Community Center front counter from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Having lived in Fircrest since childhood, Dorothy is familiar with many of our residents and has a deep knowledge of the City. All of us in the Parks & Recreation Department are excited to have her on our team in this new role.

9. Public Works Update

Public Works' current summer operating hours are 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM.

This week's highlights include:

Utilities - Water, Sewer, Streets, and Stormwater

- Summer hires have completed repainting white markings on City streets, including stop bars. They will now transition to yellow curb painting.
- On July 22nd, water shutoffs due to delinquent utility bills took place. Twelve of the 17
 properties shut off have been turned on. The five remaining properties are either vacant or for
 sale.
- On July 25th, SPM (formed by the merger of Stripe Rite and Apply-a-Line) completed roadway striping.
- We are preparing documents and bids for the sewer main pipe bursting at the 500 block of Buena Vista Avenue.
- We have been communicating with the City of Tacoma regarding the Leach Creek Holding Basin mitigation project. The contractor has begun mobilizing equipment and still needs to apply for permits with Tacoma. A construction start date has not yet been identified.

Maintenance – Parks & Facilities

- The Facilities staff is currently operating down one Maintenance Worker.
- The Facilities crew participated in Fircrest Fun Days setup, breakdown, and clean up.
- Collapsible safety bollards were installed on the north side of the Community Center to restrict unapproved vehicle access.
- Parks irrigation timing has been increased due to the impacts of dry weather.

Project Updates

- Wellhouse #7 (Claremont)
 - o Construction has been completed, and staff are reviewing the final invoice for payment.
- Fircrest Park Maintenance Facility Structure Upgrade
 - We are waiting on one final document from the contractor, Creative Custom Construction, LLC, and we will then issue a notice to proceed.
- 44th Street West & 67th Ave West Lift Station Upgrade
 - The contractor is procuring equipment and materials in preparation to start construction, with Public Works staff continuing to review material submittals.
- Stormwater Pre-Treatment Outfall Grant Project Emerson Street & Estate Place
 - o Final close-out Progress Reports and Payment Requests are in progress.
- South Orchard Street Grind & Overlay TIB Grant Funded
 - Miles Resources is scheduled to begin construction on Monday, August 5th, with a 42-day working schedule. This includes all ADA curb ramp upgrades and roadway marking installation.
 - o An Interlocal Agreement between the City of Tacoma and the City of Fircrest was approved at the July 23rd City Council meeting.
 - Change Order #1, adding a 15% contingency for City of Tacoma construction expenses, was approved at the July 23rd City Council meeting.
 - o Mass communication notifications will be posted on Monday, July 29th.

- Emerson Street Sidewalk Extension (south side) Woodside Drive to 67th Ave West
 - o The 100% design was submitted for National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review.
- Regents Blvd (west) Grind & Overlay Alameda Ave to 67th Ave West
 - o Documents were submitted to WSDOT on June 12th.
- Electron and Contra Costa Intersection Improvement Legislative Funds
 - Design is in process.
- South Orchard Street Water Main Upgrade Ramsdell Street to Holly Drive
 - o Construction began on Wednesday, July 24th, by exposing the existing water main and obtaining measurements for a new tap.
 - o The new hot tap was completed on Thursday, July 25th. The road closure remains in place during working hours, and a steel plate has been installed for overnight safety.
 - The trench excavation and installation of the new main should be completed by Tuesday, July 30th. Water purification sampling will follow, and then the final connection to the existing water system will be done by Friday, August 6th, pending purification results.
 - o Public Works has received zero questions, comments, or concerns since construction commenced. We will provide more notification and clarity next week as needed
- Claremont Street Grind & Overlay TIB Grant
 - o Design is in process.
- AMI Water Meter Exchange Program
 - o Meter exchanges are in progress, with program completion currently at 65%.
 - o Public Works staff and the contractor are working together to expedite the project.
 - o Summer hires continued meter box prep for exchanges.
